Introduction

Basically Mukta is a solo Kathak dancer. Over last twenty years Mukta has been taking systematic training from her Guru Padmashree Roshanji. She is propagating Jaipur dance style in Thane and Kalyan. With this aim Mukta has founded Nrityadhara Kathak Research Institute Mukta has performed on the prestigious dance stages at Mahua Gujarat (Puja Murai Bapus place) when her Guru received Hunmant Award, at Kolkatta when her guru received at Bhawalka Award, NCPA Mumbai, National A Grade solo Doordarshan India, Kathak Kendra Delhi (3 times), Jaipur, Jodhpur etc. Mukta has also presented dances based on novel concepts but she is always careful about not to cross the boundaries of tradition. Her experiments in Tribhangima, in which she presented artistic combination of three dance styles, and Jugalbandi of kathak and lawani won accolades. She has also worked as assistant choreographer for renowned director Shyam Bengal's film Saradari Begum.

Founded Nrityadhara which conducts different types of activities for promotion of Kathak and music arts of India, by conducting lectures, demonstrations, workshops and performances of senior and experienced artists. Nrityadhara also organizes programs of young and upcoming artists.

Her mother Zohra Begum of Ambala was a famous playback singer of her times and her father Shri Faqir Mohammed was a well-known maestro of Tabla and Pakhawaj.

Mukta choreographed wonderful ballets (Nrityanatika) like Bansileela, Pungiwala (i.e on pied piper of Hameline), Nayika Shringar, Ritu-Parva on Ravindranath Tagorji's songs in Bengali, Katha Lavanichi - ada Kathakchi (which explains classical form of Lavani dance), Rani Ki Bav (Story based on sculpture Temple Patan Gujarat)

Mukta is a very creative artist and choreographed many classical Kathak items like Tarana, Chturang, Astanayika, Traditional Hori & Thumari, Nritta in different Taala's.

"Vishwashanti Sangeet Nritya Samaroh" is new concept started by Mukta through Nrityadhara. Late Gansaraswati Kishoritai Amonkar and Pakhawaj Mastero Mr.Bhavani Shanker very Honorable artist in the Samaroh.
